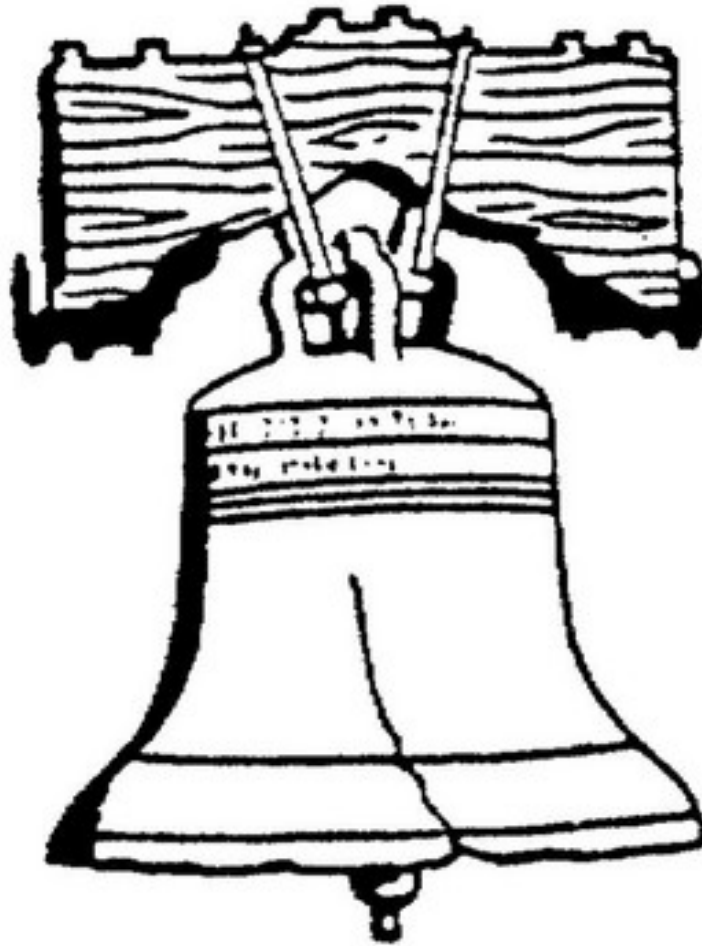


The Liberty Bell



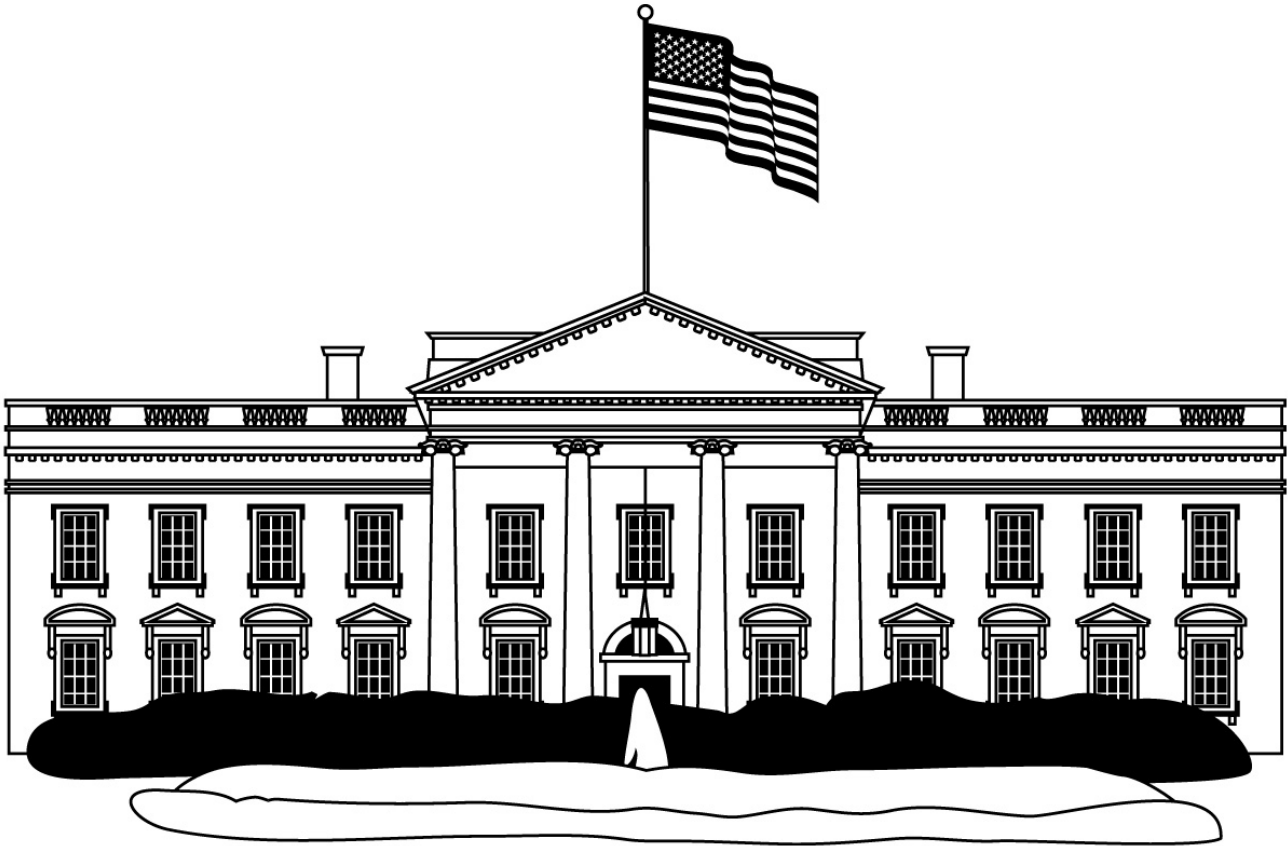

Statue of Liberty



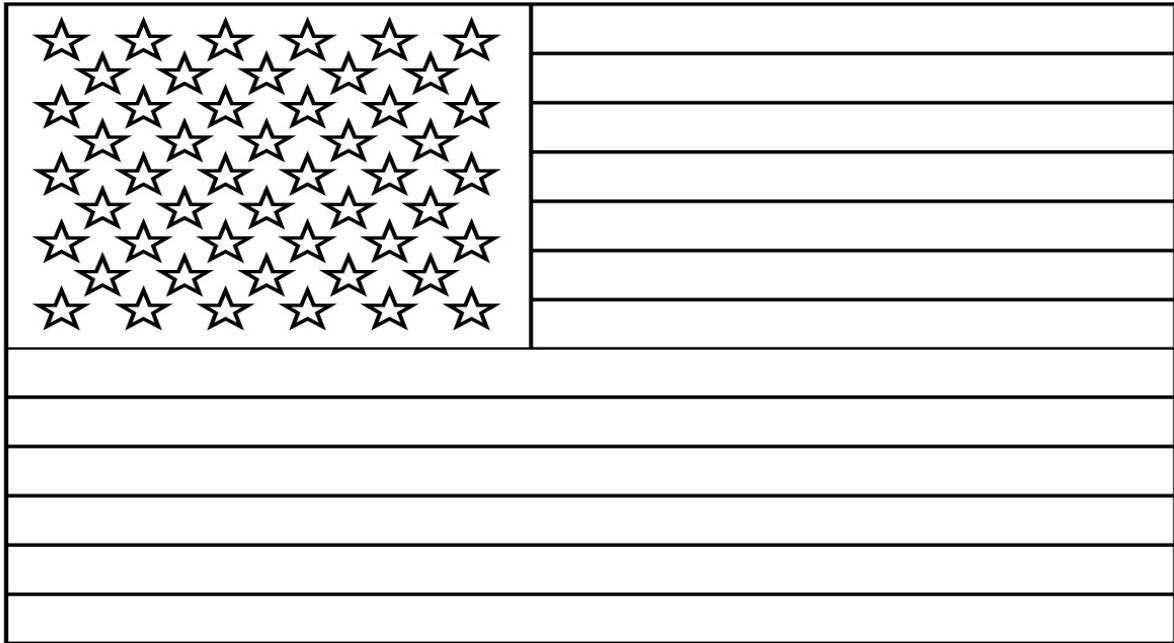

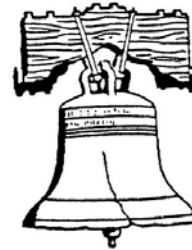

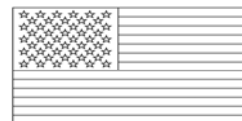
